The Rock Valley Chamber was able to provide the 'entertainment' for the day including the inflatables, petting zoo, fairytale characters, facepainting (Done by Cara and Hannah Suter), and the Dunk Tank. Project Youth put together the Kid Carnival with all the prizes and staff/parents volunteered to oversee the event that day. The community could enjoy these activities for a free-will donation, and \$4,671 was raised toward the daycare fundraising account!





RAISING FUNDS AND HAVING FUN!

Every year, there are many events that are ran as fundraisers for various organizations and businesses in Rock Valley. This year was no different.

On Thursday, August 10th, Sioux County Youth Fair board members and volunteers served nearly 800 people at the Community Meal. The Chamber chooses a non-profit Chamber member to serve the meal as a way to raise funds toward a project, which is why the meal is a free-will donation for the community. Total donation this year was \$2,757!

The Sioux County Youth Fair wants Rock Valley to know that they are thankful for this opportunity, and they had a great time serving! This money will go toward their new fairgrounds.
